NOTICE is hereby given that on 9 April 2009 West Sussex County Council made two permanent Orders under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to change the parking restrictions on Chapel Road, impose a 20 MPH speed limit zone on Worthing town centre and consolidate the restrictions prohibiting right turns from various roads onto Chapel Road.

These provisions were originally contained within the Orders advertised as part of the Chapel Road re-generation scheme. In response to the results of the public consultation for these Orders, the way the originally proposed restrictions are implemented has been changed, with an experimental Order being introduced to enact the one-way traffic restriction at the junction of Union Place and Chapel Road instead of the permanent Order originally proposed. In addition, some of the waiting and loading restrictions on Chapel Road have been altered slightly from the original proposal to better meet local needs.

A copy of the Orders, which will come into operation on 10th April 2009, together with a plan showing the affected length of road may be inspected at County Hall, Chichester, during normal office hours, and at Worthing Public Library, Richmond Road, Worthing during normal library opening hours.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of this Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks from 9th April 2009, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
