

**NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF
PUBLIC PATH ORDER
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL
(FORD) PUBLIC PATH (No 365/1)
DIVERSION ORDER 2003**

On 5th January 2006, the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs confirmed the above-named Order made under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert part of public footpath no. 365/1 in the parish of Ford commencing at a point approximately 78 metres north of its junction with Ford Lane (grid reference 9975 0377) and extending east north-eastwards across arable land for approximately 385 metres then turning east south-eastwards (grid reference 0012 0389) for approximately 25 metres passing Rife Cottage to its junction with Station Road (grid reference 0014 0389) and substituting that for a new length of public footpath with a minimum width of 2 metres commencing at the south-western end of the path to be stopped up (grid reference 9975 0377) extending in a generally east south-east direction for approximately 330 metres across an arable field (grid reference 0008 0381) then turning south-eastwards for approximately 30 metres on a farm track to join Station Road at a point south of No .4 Station Road approximately 90 metres south of the length of path to be stopped up (grid reference 0011 0381).

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be seen free of charge at the office of the Legal Services Unit, County Hall, Chichester, West Sussex and at the office of Arun District Council, Arun Civic Centre, Maltravers Road, Littlehampton, West Sussex on Mondays to Fridays from 10.00 am to 4 pm A copy of the Order and map may be purchased from the Legal Services Unit at the price of £2.

The Order is now in force but if a person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 23rd February 2006 make an application to the High Court.
